When requesting merit badge classes, please keep the following in mind:

Allow for travel between the campsite and/or merit badge sites. For example, try to keep all waterfront classes back-to-back instead of crossing the entire camp to many times in one day. Older Scouts and adult leaders can help with these logistics.

If interested in working on the various Firecrafter ranks (Camper, Woodsman, and Firecrafter), remember to allow time for service hours. Also, start on the requirements early in the week; don't wait until Friday to start working on a rank. See Mr. Helms or Mr. Crow for additional information.

It is strongly recommended that all new Scouts take the Swimming and First Aid merit badges during their first year at Summer Camp.

The merit badge classes listed in the camp brochure are those that are taught by the camp staff. Additional merit badges can be worked on in the campsite, with the approval of Mr. Helms.

Allow time for non-merit badge related activities, like open swimming, open boating, mountain biking, kayaking, open rifle shooting, open archery, etc. Remember to set aside time to just have fun and enjoy the experience of Summer Camp!
